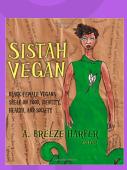

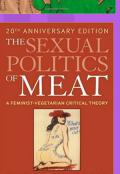


THE PERSONAL IS POLITICAL

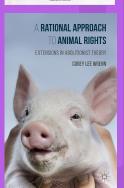

WOMEN AS MEAT

The patriarchal nature of food production propagates the social belief that female bodies are "meat" that can be butchered, bought, sold, and consumed.

ENVIRONMENT

The UN identifies animal agriculture as the leading cause of climate change. Environmental destruction disproportionately impacts women and nonhuman animals.

ACCORDING TO THE UNITED NATIONS, WOMEN COMPRISE ABOUT 43% OF THE AGRICULTURAL LABOR FORCE GLOBALLY

WOMEN ARE LESS LIKELY TO OWN LAND AND ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE UNPAID OR PART-TIME WORKERS
